THE BIDEN ADMINISTRATION/EXECUTIVE BRANCH

April 12, 2023. The Biden Administration (Environmental Protection Agency) announced new proposed federal vehicle emissions standards to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. The first set of proposed standards announced, the "Multi-Pollutant Emissions Standards for Model Years 2027 and Later Light-Duty and Medium Duty Vehicles"," builds on EPA's existing emissions standards for passenger cars and light trucks for MYs 2023 through 2026. The proposal retains the proven regulatory design of previous EPA standards for light-duty vehicles, but leverages advances in clean car technology to further reduce both climate pollution and smog- and soot-forming emissions. Between 2027 and 2055, the total projected net benefits of the light- and medium-duty proposal range from \$850 billion to \$1.6 trillion; the proposal is expected to avoid 7.3 billion tons of CO2 emissions through 2055. Rule Summary here iii. A virtual public hearing is scheduled for May 9-10, 2023. The second set of proposed standards announced, the "Greenhouse Gas Standards for Heavy-Duty Vehicles - Phase 3iv," would apply to heavy-duty vocational vehicles (such as delivery trucks, refuse haulers or dump trucks, public utility trucks, transit, shuttle, school buses) and trucks typically used to haul freight. These standards would complement the criteria pollutant standards for MY 2027 and beyond heavy-duty vehicles that EPA finalized in December 2022 and represent the third phase of EPA's Clean Trucks Plan. The projected net benefits of the heavy-duty proposal range from \$180 billion to \$320 billion; the proposal is projected to avoid 1.8 billion tons of CO2 through 2055. Rule Summary <u>here</u>^v. A virtual public meeting is scheduled for May 2-3, 2023.

March 31, 2023. The U.S. Treasury Department and the IRS released proposed guidance (Notice of Proposed Rulemaking^{vi}) (to be published in the FR on April 17, 2023) on the new clean vehicle provisions of the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). The NPRM provides information to manufacturers on the IRA requirements that vehicles eligible for the clean vehicle credit undergo final assembly in North America and do not exceed a Manufacturers Suggested Retail Price of \$80,000 for a van, pickup truck, or sport utility vehicle, or \$55,000 for any other vehicle. To be eligible for a \$7,500 credit, clean vehicles must meet sourcing requirements for both the critical minerals and battery components contained in the vehicle. That is, vehicles that meet one of the two requirements (1. North American battery parts and 2.) Battery minerals from the U.S.) are eligible for a \$3,750 credit. The criteria will take effect on April 18, 2023, when a list of models that qualify for the tax credit will be issued. E.G., the battery minerals credit requires at least 40 percent of battery minerals, based on value, to be extracted or processed in the U.S. or countries that have free-trade agreements with the U.S., or recycled in North America. In short, the rules are more stringent and fewer electric vehicles will likely qualify for the full \$7,500 credit.

APPROPRIATIONS/BUDGET

FY 2024 APPROPRIATIONS UPDATE/PROCESS

As reported in the TG&A March Report, the annual appropriations cycle was initiated with the President's budget submission; President Biden released his FY 2024 Proposed Budget^{vii} on March 9, 2023, to Congress, which provided an outline of the Administration's government-wide

recommended federal funding levels and programmatic tax and policy priorities. Optimally, Congress is to next consider a **Budget Resolution** to set a framework and spending ceilings for the upcoming year. The Budget Resolution is being delayed due to broader negotiations over raising the debt ceiling. Meanwhile, the respective House/Senate Budget and Appropriation Committees have been holding hearings on the President's budget and are beginning to consider the 12 annual appropriations bills for FY 2024. Typically, the House begins to consider the annual appropriation bills sometime in the month of May.

DEBT LIMIT UPDATE

The <u>debt limit</u> —commonly called the debt ceiling—is the maximum amount of debt that the Department of the Treasury can issue to the public or to other federal agencies. On December 16, 2021, President Joe Biden signed legislation increasing the debt ceiling by \$2.5 trillion to a total ceiling, or cap, of \$31.4 trillion, which is expected to fund government activities through mid-2023, (this summer or early fall) when the Treasury Department is expected to run out of so-called "extraordinary measures to stave off a national default. As of April 10, 2023, the Total Public Debt Outstanding was \$31.457 billion (see nearby table). Currently the White House and House Republicans are disputing how to address the debt ceiling, and the scope of the overall FY 2024 budget. The White House/Democrats want to pass a clean bill to raise the debt limit while Republicans want to limit spending in the new budget.

FY 2024 EARMARK UPDATE

House members were to have submitted <u>Community Project Funding</u> requests and Programmatic/Language requests through the <u>House Appropriations Committee^{ix}</u> for all federal agencies by March 31, 2023. Subsequently, House members are to post on their official websites any Community Project Requests (guidance <u>here^x</u> and deadlines <u>here^{xi}</u>, e.g., <u>Transportation CPF projects to be posted by 4/17/2023</u>). Recall that House members were limited to 15 requests across all bills. **Senate members** were to have submitted Congressionally Directed Spending requests and Programmatic/Language request through the <u>Senate Appropriations Committee^{xii}</u> for transportation projects by April 6, 2023. The House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, Subcommittee on Highways and Transit held a hearing to discuss and receive testimony on matters pertaining to, "<u>Reviewing the Implementation of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.</u>" <u>Committee Link and Testimony</u>*iv.

April 6, 2023. The US Department of Labor issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity^{xxi} (NOFO) making available \$80 million under the Building Pathways to Infrastructure Jobs Grant Program. The DOL Building Pathways to Infrastructure Jobs Grant Program will invest in public-private partnerships to develop, implement, and scale worker-centered sector strategy training programs in H-1B industries and occupations critical to meeting the goals of the IIJA. The DOL expects the availability of approximately \$80 million to fund 15-25 grants for the first round of funding. This program requires cost sharing or matching funds.

Applications for Round 1 are due by 11:59 p.m. ET on July 7, 2023. Round 2 will open on March 15, 2024 and applications must be submitted by June 14, 2024.

April 5, 2023. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) making available one award of \$1.5 million per year, subject to the availability of funds, for a total potential Federal share of \$7.5 million to establish a new Center of Excellence on New Mobility and Automated Vehicles (Mobility COE). The Mobility COE shall seek to develop an understanding of how new mobility and automated vehicles may impact the evolving transportation system when deployed at scale. The planned award type is a cost reimbursement Cooperative Agreement with an 80/20 funding match. The competition is open to all eligible parties and their partnering organizations. Eligible parties include: institutions of higher education, public research entities, Federally Funded Research and Development Center, national laboratories, and private research entities. The FHWA plans to conduct outreach regarding this program in the form of a virtual meeting on April 17, 2023, Eastern Standard Time. Applications are due June 6, 2023.

March 31, 2023. The US DOT issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity^{xxiii} (NOFO – and here^{xxiv}) making available \$1,177,213,000 (\$1 billion in advance appropriations from the IIJA, plus \$177,213,000 in carryover funds from FY 2022) under the FY 2023 Safe Streets and Roads for All Funding Opportunity (SS4A) discretionary program. Note that CCTA was just awarded in February the largest SS4A grant in the state of California, for \$28 million.

March 21, 2023. The US DOT announced the first round of grants totaling over \$94 million for 59 projects across the country through the new Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) Grants Program. The maximum award per project was \$2,000,000 in this round of funding. The first year of the program was oversubscribed with \$6 of applications for every \$1 available for grants. The next funding opportunity of \$100 million is expected to be released fall 2023. The full list of awards totaling \$94,783,781 can be viewed here **Example 1.00 million is expected to be released fall 2023.

March 17, 2023. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) issued a Notice/Request for Comments to seek comments on its existing general applicability waiver for manufactured products under its Buy America waiver authorities. See AASHTO March 10, 2023 comments here**

OTHER REPORTS/NOTICES/NEWS ARTICLES

April 10, 2023. The Government Accountability Office (GAO) issued a report entitled, "Capital Investment Grants (CIG) Program: Cost Predictions Have Improved, but the Pandemic Complicates Assessing Ridership Predictions**." The Federal Transit Administration's CIG program helps cities, states, and localities build transit systems such as commuter rail. Grant applicants must develop capital cost and ridership predictions. FTA uses the predictions to help select projects and to later determine if a project delivered expected results. FTA's reports indicate that project sponsors' predictions of capital costs and ridership have improved. In the 2020 report, FTA found that about 86 percent of the projects discussed had actual capital costs within 10 percent of predicted costs and 48 percent of the projects had actual ridership within 20 percent of predicted ridership.

March 31, 2023. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a decision that grants two requests for waivers (and here voxii) of preemption regarding four California Air Resource Board (CARB) regulations related to California's heavy-duty vehicle and engine emission standards. Under the Clean Air Act, California is afforded broad discretion to adopt emissions requirements to meet their significant air quality challenges, but they must seek waivers from EPA for new motor vehicle emission standards. In this instance, CARB requested two waivers for regulations relating to heavy duty vehicles and engines. That is, in 2020, CARB proposed new rules for heavy trucks and requested a waiver from EPA to apply them to heavy duty vehicles sold within its borders. As a result, California will now require that 55 percent of delivery vans and small trucks, 75 percent of buses and larger trucks, and 40 percent of tractor trailers and other big rigs sold in the state be battery-electric by 2035. CARB is expected to approve the final version of its Advanced Clean Trucks regulations later this month. The new rules will take effect next year and require manufacturers to produce zero emission trucks beginning in 2024 with production targets that increase annually. See article here vaxiii.

March 31, 2023. The Congressional Research Service issued a report entitled, "Biden Administration Proposes Temporary Operating Assistance Authority for Larger Transit Agencies XXXXIV." In the FY2024 budget, the Biden Administration proposes allowing larger public transportation agencies greater flexibility in the use of Urbanized Area Formula funds to cope with the larger operating deficits caused by the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic.
